Week of Caring:

Your company volunteer group will be connected to a local nonprofit, to engage in a meaningful day of service. There's something for everyone to help make our community a better place for everyone to live, work and play.

In 2019, more than 1,000 volunteers completed 133 projects for 26 nonprofits. The financial impact of Week of Caring is estimated at nearly \$150,000 for a cumulative 6,000 hours of work.

Vello Volunteers:

Vello is one-on-one online tutoring opportunity that makes volunteering and community impact easy. Your employees can read with kids without leaving their desk.

Your employees will be a company team and be matched to a local classroom to provide 1:1 reading support a class of 1st - 4th grade students. This tutor program runs through the school year with just 30 minutes a week of their time.

Customized Volunteer Opportunity:

We can customize a volunteer opportunity suited for your team. Whether you have a few hours or a full day, we can facilitate a customized volunteer opportunity that fits the three pillars of the United Way: health, education and financial stability.

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Poverty Simulation:

United Way will facilitate an annual poverty simulation. The 2-3 hour exercise is a great way to learn more about hard working families who struggle every day. The simulation offers participants a realistic approach to walking in their shoes by simulating "one month" of poverty. Following the exercise participants will share feedback about their experience during a debriefing session.

Women United: Over 150 area women professionals representing a wide variety of businesses and industries gather for quarterly networking sessions featuring a guest speaker. Professional development, philanthropy and community service opportunities are highlighted, creating social but impactful events.

Emerging Leaders: CONNECT. SERVE. LEAD. This United Way group advances our community through service, connection, and leadership by taking part in professional development through family-friendly networking events, volunteering opportunities and innovative leadership training.
